

Main Topics:

Module 1: Starting a Journey of Self Discovery

Module 2: Beyond Self and into the Community

Key Outcomes:

Students will set individual learning goals and have the opportunity to use technology to practise their literacy.

Students will be able to discuss topics related to their personal lives.

Students will be able to describe their family, education, hobbies and likes and dislikes.

Main Topics:

- Forming a Personal and Independent Opinion
- Delegation and Representation
- Political Parties and Electoral Programmes

Key Outcomes:

- Students will learn the importance of being informed about issues and how their opinion matters.
- They will learn about different political parties and how elections work

Main Topics:

- Learning about different types of jobs
- Identifying interests, skills, and motivations
- Learning how to apply for a job

Key Outcomes:

- Students will learn about the different types of jobs they are interested in and what would suit their personality type and experience.
- Students will learn the process of applying for a job from job advertisements to interviews.

Key Outcomes:

Students will learn how to discuss a broad range of topics connected with the wider world.
Students will learn practical tasks such as budgeting, planning an event and setting goals.
Students will set individual

Key Outcomes:

Students will learn how politics works at local, national and European elections. They will learn about the process of a referendum and how to cast their vote in elections.

Main Topics:

Unit 1: Me, Myself & I

Unit 2: Relationships & Sexuality

Key Outcomes:

Students will learn about feelings, how to recognise their skills & build on their self esteem. They will also learn how to look after themselves by making decisions & taking responsibility of their own bodies. Students will learn about different relationships, sexuality, safety & privacy.

Students will explore the transition to adulthood. This will look at making choices, setting life goals, preparing for college and work, and other steps to help them live as an independent adult.

Main Topics:

- What having a job involves: How should I behave? What should I do?
- The difference between a colleague and a friend
- Time keeping & Money Management.

Key Outcomes:

Students will be prepared in a practical way for different situations in the workplace. They will learn about appropriate behaviours and dress, understanding a job description and how to follow instructions.
